

When creating a citation for the National Institute of Health Genetics Home Reference pages, you need to analyze the page you are on and modify the example:

- Highlighted in yellow indicates where you would put the name of your page, for example one of the names of the pages below :

Home page: National Library of Medicine (US)

Condition, gene, or chromosome summary

Help Me Understand Genetics page

Illustration

Chromosomes and mtDNA page

- Highlighted in green would remain the same in each citation.
- Highlighted in blue would need to be replaced by the "published" date, which is posted at the bottom of every page on Genetics Home Reference
- Highlighted in purple would be the title of your article.
- You will also need to replace the date in gray after the word "cited" with the latest date you viewed the information online.
- Highlighted in light pink would be The "reviewed" date which can be found at the bottom of the pages you are using.
- Estimate the number of screens.
- Add your URL from the page you are citing.
